Speakers and Sessions include:

The UK Launch of a European Community of Generosity:

an informal network of individuals and Christian organisations across Europe who commit to being generous stewards. Members will be encouraged to influence and nurture stewardship, generosity and giving as a core value of the European Church. The intention is to enable connection, networking and collaboration with other generosity champions and to share and distribute resources, stories and information on events and initiatives. This is much wider than the current refugee crisis, but this provides a clear demonstration of the conflict between fear and generosity in our continent.



We will be joined by Dr Sas Conradie, an ordained minister in the Dutch Reformed Church in South Africa, and Co-ordinator of the Global Generosity Network.

Speakers include:




