M2M INSTITUTE FOR MINISTRY TO MUSLIMS

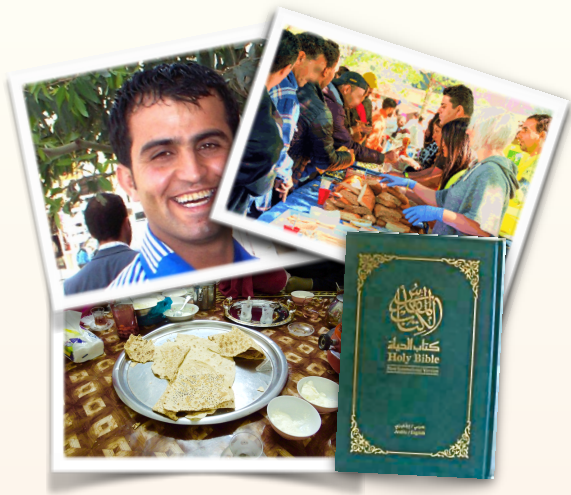


The Institute for Ministry to Muslims offers intensive, one-week courses on Islam to be held in Brussels. Classes are presented in English with French translation available.

MINISTRY TO MUSLIM FAMILIES JUNE 6-10

Key issues affecting Muslim women in their families, communities, and religious lives and Christian dependence on the Holy Spirit to establish a witness to Muslim women.

Born in Iran and raised in diverse cultures of the Philippines, Nepal, Pakistan, and Malaysia, Donna lived and served in three countries in Eurasia, among Muslim women. Donna is an International Trainer with Global Initiative: Reaching Muslim Peoples. She is currently an Intercultural Studies doctoral student at the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary.

ISLAM IN EUROPE JUNE 13-17

An exploration into the history and development of Islam in Europe and the implications of this for European society and church. The class will focus on understanding various expressions of being Muslim in Europe and how to reach out to them with the love of Christ.

A native of Eethen, the Netherlands, Bert earned degrees in Religious Studies, World Evangelism, and Transformational Leadership in Christian-Muslim relations. Bert has authored books, developed courses, and served in positions focusing on ministry to Muslims with Arab World Ministries, Operation Mobilisation, and the European Evangelical Alliance.

PENTECOSTAL CHURCH DYNAMICS IN MUSLIM CONTEXTS SEPTEMBER 5-9

From the accounts of the Early Church, which practiced the tandem of proclamation and power in a fundamental monotheistic Jewish context, we will learn that the same absolutes may be applied to proclaim the gospel in power to Muslim peoples in our contexts today.

Now President of Assemblies of God Theological Seminary, Mark is past director of Global Initiative: Reaching Muslim Peoples and past Central Eurasia area director for Assemblies of God World Missions. Mark and his wife Lynda started Teen Challenge Pakistan. With more than 30 years of ministry experience, Mark equips and mobilizes students to reach Muslims everywhere.

CHRISTIAN-MUSLIM THEOLOGICAL ISSUES SEPTEMBER 12-16

An examination of the key theological challenges of Islam and the Christian response with special emphasis placed upon biblical references. After studying the congruencies and divergencies between Christianity and Islam, the course offers applications for communicating the Gospel.



Instructor: Sam Brelo, D.Min.

Currently Assistant to the Academic Dean of Continental Theological Seminary, Sam and his wife Naomi have served as missionaries with the Assemblies of God World Missions for 28 years. Their ministry has focused on evangelism, discipling, and leadership training among Sunni Muslims, Shiite Muslims, Druze, Armenians, Catholics and Greek Orthodox.
